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NURS3505 Essential Clinical Skills for Registered Nurses

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to gain proficiency and confidence in performing essential psychomotor skills required to practice nursing in Canada at an entry-to-practice level. The course includes hands-on training with mentors and educators in both clinical and lab settings. It covers skills such as patient assessment, wound care, infection control, medication administration, and post-surgical procedures. Students will also improve their application of psychomotor skills through the use of clinical reasoning and judgment. Proficiency in using various medical equipment is also emphasized. The course aims to equip students with the necessary tools to provide patient-centered care and effectively manage patient care.
